Objective: This recitation is designed to reinforce what you'll learn in lecture, not replace it. In recitation, you will have the opportunity to ask questions on topics covered in lecture, review important concepts, do exercises and generally become more comfortable with the material. Grading

Your recitation grade accounts for **20% of your overall grade**. The 20% is divided into two categories: **Quizzes (10%)** and **In-class Assignments (10%)**. There will be no extra credit available.

In-class Assignments (IC)

You will have a total of **3 in-class assignments**. These will be worksheets that you will work on with a group of classmates. The lowest of these scores will be dropped, which means each IC accounts for 5% of your total grade.

Quizzes

You will have a total of **4 in-class quizzes** throughout the semester. These quizzes will directly prepare you for your midterms. If you are unable to take the quiz when scheduled, **you must notify me in advance**. Answer keys will be posted online after all recitations have taken the quiz. Each quiz accounts for 2.5% of your total grade.
